FARMER'S CASSEROLE (for 12)

6 cups frozen shredded hash brown potatoes
1 1/2 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese with jalapeno peppers or shredded cheddar (opt)
2 cups diced cooked ham or Canadian-style bacon or cooked sausage (bacon was used at the rally)
1/2 c. sliced green onions
8 eggs or 2 cups fresh egg product
2 12 oz cans (1 1/2 c.) evaporated milk
1/4 t. salt
1/4 t. pepper
Grease 1 3 qt baking dish, Arrange the potatoes evenly in dish. Sprinkle with cheese meat and onion. Beat eggs till they are mixed add the milk, salt and pepper. Pour over potato mixture. You can make this the night before, cover and chill. Bake uncovered in a 350-degree oven for 45 to 55 minutes. If chilled increase baking time to 55 to 60 min.

Note:

This recipe is for 12 servings, Pam also made one with regular milk instead of evaporated milk and it turned out fine.
