CHANGING POLAR-AIRE FAN MOTOR

Polar-Aire has been bought out by Shurflo. Shurflo still provides replacement parts for Polar-Aire fans. (My motor and screen were provided at no charge.) Shurflo's point of contact is Maria Avalos at MariaAvalos@pentairwater.com. Super service!

Shurflo's replacement motor mounting is not the same as Polar-Aire's. Polar-Aire's motor is mounted in the fan housing with three "L" brackets. Shurflo's motor does not have the required holes in the motor casing to attach the brackets.



The brackets are required to (1) prevent the motor from falling through the housing, and (2) to prevent the motor from rotating.

I attached a hose clamp around the motor casing to prevent the motor from falling through the housing. To prevent rotation I had to file the molded nubs on the brackets flush. (The nubs protruded from the bracket to fit into a small hole in the motor casing.) I then attached the brackets to the housing. Using a second hose clamp around the upper portion of the brackets including the motor, I applied enough pressure against the brackets to press against the motor casing to prevent rotation.



The Shurflo motor has three screws in the shaft end of the motor casing. I could not think of a way to use them for mounting the motor, and since they were not interfering in any way, I just left them in place.



I recently had problems with a high resistance ground on my trailer running lights. Nelson's RV in Vacaville was able to troubleshoot and correct my problem. The problem was the grounding system for the clearance lights, tail lights, brake lights and back-up lights all have one common ground to the frame. For electrical continuity the tail/brake/back-up light assembly relies upon pop rivets to ground between sections. Over eight years these rivets corroded enough to create a high resistance ground causing the lights to be very dim. The rivets join very thin metal parts. Rather than trying to drill out and replace the rivets, Nelson's RV added a separate grounding system to the existing assemblies.

Nelson's RV Vacaville is a small two bay (with two exterior bays) RV repair facility. They are always booked up for weeks in advanced. They are very knowledgeable and professional, plus they are nice people. Very reasonable rates. I rate them very high.
